Reading

In reading, we will continue to use our Reach for Reading program to focus on skills and strategies that help us become better readers. Students will explore inferencing, finding sensory details, and the main idea and details. They will be reading several non-fiction stories as well as poetry from the program to help reiterate these skills.

Writing

Last week we finished up our thankful letters. Next week we will begin our opinion writing unit. Students will be investigating and writing their persuasive essays on rats. They'll learn to support their opinion with evidence that will allow readers to think through the various sides of the argument. They will conduct research and analyze the evidence that supports their claim before drafting. In addition, students will assess their work using checklists to see how they worked toward their goals this unit and what they will do to improve their writing on the next unit.

Math:

Students are concluding Topic 6 Connect Area to Multiplication and Addition next week. Students developed a deep understanding of the concept of area and how area is related to multiplication and addition. Next week, we will begin Topic 7 Represent and Interpret Data. This will include making picture graphs, bar graphs, and interpreting data represented on different graphs.

History/Geography

We have been busy researching the 13 colonies and discovering how the colonists made it safely to America. Students are continuing to be detectives to "read the files" about each colony. They are taking notes in their research notebook for this unit. They are really having fun discovering how the colonists survived with almost nothing and created an entire colony. This year we will be celebrating the end of this unit a little differently. We will be making soap and celebrating our learning in our classrooms on Thursday December 5th and Friday December 6th.
